- **Tele MANAS:** Tele MANAS was launched in 2022 by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare with **technical support** from NIMHANS and IIIT Bengaluru. Its core aim is to provide **24x7 tele mental health counseling**, with the **target of establishing at least one center** in every State and UT across India.

2.3 [Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyaan \(NMBA\)](#)

Why in News

2.4 [National Education Society for Tribal Students \(NESTS\)](#)

Why in News

- The **National Education Society for Tribal Students (NESTS)** was launched in 2019 under the **Ministry of Tribal Affairs** and celebrated its **7th Foundation Day** recently.
 - Its primary goal is to deliver **high-quality, holistic education** to tribal students by administering **Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRS)**.
- **EMRS:** Initiated in 1997–98, EMRS aims to provide **quality education** to **Scheduled Tribe (ST) children in remote areas**, equipping them to pursue higher and professional education and secure employment in various sectors.
 - Each EMRS accommodates **480 students**, from **Class VI to XII**.
 - Schools are established in **blocks with over 50% ST population** and at least **20,000 tribal residents**.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES

2.5 [11th BRICS Environment Ministers' Meeting](#)

Why in News

- **11th BRICS Environment Ministers' Meeting (2025):** Held in **Brasilia, Brazil**, India emphasized **collective leadership** to drive the **2030 Climate Agenda**.
 - Discussions included the **Baku to Belem Roadmap**, which seeks to secure **USD 1.3 trillion** in climate finance to support **Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)**.

- **Green Grids Initiative – One Sun One World One Grid (GGI-OSOWOG):**
 - In **2021**, **India-led OSOWOG (2018)** merged with the **UK-led Green Grids Initiative** and was jointly launched as **GGI-OSOWOG** at **COP26** in **Glasgow**, promoting global solar grid connectivity and sustainability.
- **BRICS Environmentally Sound Technology (BEST) Platform:**
 - Established in **2015**, its mission is to **exchange best practices and green technologies** for achieving the **Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)**.
 - **Key Initiatives under BEST:**
 - ✓ **BRICS Clean Rivers Programme (2016)**.
 - ✓ **BRICS Partnership for Urban Environment Sustainability (2017)**.
- **BRICS:** Originally coined as **BRIC** by economist **Jim O'Neill** in **2001**, the group included **Brazil, Russia, India, and China**.
 - The **first formal BRIC summit** was held in **2009** in **Yekaterinburg, Russia**. **South Africa** joined in **2010**, making it **BRICS**.
 - The group functions across **three core pillars**: **Political and Security Cooperation**, **Financial and Economic Cooperation**, and **Cultural and People-to-People Cooperation**.
 - In **2024**, **Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the United Arab Emirates** became full-time members.
 - Subsequently, **Indonesia** joined in **2025**, making **BRICS** a **10-member intergovernmental organization** as of April 2025.

2.6 [Government e-Marketplace \(GeM\)](#)

Why in News

- In **FY 2024–25**, it facilitated the **hiring of over 1 million manpower resources** by various government organizations, showcasing its growing role in public service delivery.
- **GeM:** Launched in **2016** under the **Ministry of Commerce and Industry** (Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade), GeM is India's **online public procurement portal**, developed as part of the **Digital India** initiative.
 - GeM is operated by **GeM SPV**, a **Section 8 company** under the Companies Act, 2013, and is managed by a consortium comprising **Intellect Design Arena, Infibeam, and Tata Communications**.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

2.7 [Sevottam Framework](#)

Why in News

- The **Sevottam Framework** aims to enhance **public service delivery** by focusing on three pillars: the **Citizen's Charter**, **grievance redressal mechanisms**, and **capacity building**.
- **CPGRAMS**:
 - Launched in 2007 by the **Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG)**.
 - Provides a centralized platform for **citizen grievance redressal**, excluding issues like **court matters**, **family disputes**, **RTI**, and **national security**.
 - Grievances must be resolved within **21 days**, and appeals (if any) are to be filed within **30 days**, with resolution expected in another **30 days**.
 - The **Directorate of Public Grievances (DPG)** acts as an appellate authority for unresolved complaints.

2.8 [Central Adoption Resource Authority \(CARA\)](#)

Why in News

- India recorded **4,515 child adoptions** in FY 2024–25, the highest in 12 years.
- **CARA Overview**: Established in **1990** under the **Ministry of Women and Child Development**, CARA's mission is to ensure the **welfare and adoption** of orphaned, abandoned, and surrendered children.
 - CARA categorizes children into 5 groups: **Orphan**, **Abandoned**, **Surrendered**, **Children with No Visitation**, and **Children with Unfit Guardians**.
- **CARINGS Portal**:
 - The **Child Adoption Resource Information and Guidance System (CARINGS)**, launched in **2011**, is a digital platform for monitoring the **entire adoption process**, including **post-adoption follow-ups**.
 - It supports both **in-country** and **inter-country adoptions**.

2.9 [Hamari Parampara Hamari Virasat](#)

Why in News

- The Ministry of Panchayati Raj is organizing a national-level program under the initiative "**Hamari Parampara Hamari Virasat**" to honor **Bhagwan Birsa Munda's** legacy.
- **Launch and Purpose**: Launched on **26th January 2025** by the **Department of Panchayati Raj, Government of Jharkhand**, and supported by the **Ministry of Panchayati Raj**, this initiative aims to **preserve and celebrate tribal heritage**, including **folk songs**, **festivals**, and **traditional worship practices** tied to tribal self-governance systems.

2.10 India-Australia Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (Ind-Aus ECTA)

Why in News

- Celebrating its **3rd anniversary**, the Ind-Aus ECTA has led to a significant rise in **bilateral trade**, reaching **USD 24 billion** in **2023–24**. The agreement came into effect in **2022**.
- Building on this, a more expansive **Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA)** is under negotiation, aiming to include **MSMEs, agri-tech, critical minerals, sports, and innovation**, with a trade target of **AUD 100 billion** by 2030.

2.11 6th BIMSTEC Summit

Why in News

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi participated in the 6th BIMSTEC (Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation) Summit in **Thailand**.
- The summit was centered around the theme "**BIMSTEC: Prosperous, Resilient and Open**".
- **India's 21-Point Action Plan Highlights:**
 - Establishment of **BIMSTEC Centres of Excellence** in India focusing on **Disaster Management, Maritime Transport, Traditional Medicine, and Agriculture Research & Training**.
 - Launch of the **BODHI (BIMSTEC for Organized Development of Human Resource Infrastructure) Initiative** to train **300 youth** annually from BIMSTEC nations.
 - Announcements for hosting the **BIMSTEC Athletics Meet (2025)**, **Traditional Music Festival (2025)**, and **First BIMSTEC Games (2027)**.
 - The **BIMSTEC Energy Centre** in **Bengaluru** has become operational.
- **Adopted Documents and Agreements:**
 - The summit concluded with the adoption of the **Summit Declaration**, **BIMSTEC Bangkok Vision 2030**, and the **BIMSTEC Maritime Transport Agreement**, targeting the creation of a **PRO (Prosperous, Resilient, and Open) BIMSTEC** by 2030.
- **BIMSTEC Background:**
 - Founded in **1997** through the **Bangkok Declaration**, BIMSTEC includes **Bangladesh, India, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Myanmar, Bhutan, and Nepal**.
 - Its **Secretariat** is based in **Dhaka, Bangladesh** (since 2014).
 - The **BIMSTEC Charter** was adopted during the **5th Summit in Colombo (2022)**.
 - It focuses on **7 key cooperation sectors**: **Agriculture and Food Security, Connectivity, Environment and Climate Change, People-to-People Contact, Science & Technology, Security, and Trade & Development**.

INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC ISSUES

2.12 India-US Bilateral Trade

Why in News

- The **US President's executive order** imposes additional duties on imports from all trading partners starting **April 2025**, with a **baseline tariff of 10%** from **April 5** and **country-specific duties** from **April 9**. For India, this results in a **27% additional tariff** on top of the baseline rate.
- **Trade Volume and Targets:** In **2023–24**, the **US** was India's largest trading partner. The **Mission 500**, jointly announced by the Indian PM and the US President, targets **USD 500 billion** in trade by 2030.
- **Strategic Initiatives and Export Push:**
 - The **COMPACT** (Catalysing Opportunities for Military Partnership, Accelerated Commerce & Technology) **initiative**, launched in **February 2025**, is central to India-US collaboration in **military partnership, commerce, and technology**.
 - To enhance exports, the **Union Budget 2025** allocated **₹2,250 crore** for an **Export Promotion Mission**.
 - Comparatively, **China** was India's **second-largest trading partner**.

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN INDIA

2.13 Infrastructure Related Initiatives

Why in News

- The Government of India is leveraging the 'Make in India' initiative to accelerate infrastructure development.
- **PM Gati Shakti – National Master Plan:** Launched in **2021**, this GIS-based digital platform integrates **16 Ministries** to streamline infrastructure development across sectors.
 - All projects over **₹500 crore** are reviewed by the **Network Planning Group (NPG)**.
 - The initiative aims to **cut logistics costs** from **13–14% to 8% of GDP**.
- **'Make in India' Initiative:**
 - Launched in **2014** under the **Ministry of Commerce and Industry**, it aims to transform India into a **global design and manufacturing hub**, attract **FDI**, and create **jobs**.
 - It focuses on **25 key sectors** (e.g., automobiles, textiles, aviation) and allows **100% FDI** in most sectors through the automatic route.
- **Flagship Infrastructure Projects:**
 - **Vande Bharat Trains** (launched in 2019): India's first **indigenously designed** semi-high-speed trains.
 - **Atal Tunnel (HP):** World's longest **highway tunnel** above **10,000 ft (9.02 km)**.

- **Chenab Bridge (J&K):** World's highest railway bridge.
- **Statue of Unity (Gujarat):** Tallest statue globally (182 meters).
- **Zojila Tunnel (J&K):** Asia's longest tunnel (13.14 km).
- **Namo Bharat Train:** Operational on the **Delhi–Meerut RRTS** corridor.
- **National Infrastructure Growth Statistics (2025):**
 - **National Highway Network:** Reached **1,46,145 km**.
 - **Aviation Sector:** Now **3rd largest domestic market** globally with **159 operational airports** by March 2025.
 - **Metro Network:** Expanded to **1,011 km** across **20 cities**, supporting urban mass transit growth.

 - ✓ Chennai–Kamarajar–Cuddalore,
 - ✓ Paradip and other Non-Major Ports
 - **2 clusters with >500 MTPA capacity:**
 - ✓ Deendayal–Tuna Tekra,
 - ✓ Jawaharlal Nehru–Vadhavan

2.15 [Industrial Entrepreneurs Memorandum \(IEM\) Acknowledgment](#)

Why in News

- Effective **April 1, 2025**, the **Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT)** revised the eligibility criteria for **IEM acknowledgment**, now requiring an **investment in plant and machinery/equipment of over ₹125 crore** and an **annual turnover exceeding ₹500 crore**.
- The IEM remains a mandatory requirement for **large-scale industries** under **compulsory licensing provisions** of the **Industries (Development & Regulation) Act, 1951**.

2.16 [India's Maritime Strategy](#)

Why in News

- Under the leadership of the **Ministry of Ports, Shipping & Waterways (MoPSW)**, India aims to become a **global maritime power** by expanding its **port capacity** from **2,600 MTPA** to **10,000 MTPA** by **2047**.
- **Green Tug Transition Programme (GTTP):**
 - Launched on **May 22, 2023**, as part of the '**Panch Karma Sankalp**', this program targets a **complete transition to green tugs** in **Indian Major Ports** by **2040**.
 - From **2033 onward**, all new tugs must comply with **ASTDS-GTTP standards**.
 - **Phase 1** begins on **October 1, 2024**, and runs till **December 31, 2027**, involving **4 Major Ports** (JNPA, Deendayal, Paradip, and V.O. Chidambaranar), each procuring at least **two battery-electric green tugs**.
- **Panch Karma Sankalp Initiatives:**
 - 4 other sankalps Include **30% financial support** for promoting **green shipping**, development of **Deendayal and VO Chidambaranar Ports** as **Green Hydrogen Hubs**, launch of a **Single Window Portal** for river and sea cruises, and the transformation of **JNPA and VO Chidambaranar Ports** into **smart ports** by **2024**.

2.17 Global Climate Change Council

Why in News

- Ahead of **COP30 (November 2025)**, **Brazil** has proposed the creation of a **Global Climate Change Council** under the **UNFCCC**, aimed at **accelerating COP decisions**, strengthening **global coordination**, and making **climate action** more **efficient and effective**.

MONETARY AND FISCAL POLICY

2.18 54th meeting of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC)

Key Announcements

- **Foreign Portfolio Investment (FPI) Caps Unchanged for FY 2025–26:**
 - **Government securities** cap remains at **6%**, **state government securities** at **2%**, and **corporate bonds** at **15%**.
 - **FPI investment limits:**
 - ✓ **Government bonds:** ₹2.79 trillion (Apr–Sep), ₹2.89 trillion (Oct–Mar)
 - ✓ **Corporate bonds:** ₹8.22 trillion (Apr–Sep), ₹8.80 trillion (Oct–Mar)
- **UPI Transaction Limit Updates:**
 - **Person-to-Merchant (P2M)** limits to be revised by **NPCI** for greater flexibility.
 - **Person-to-Person (P2P)** transaction limit remains at **₹1 lakh**.

- Special categories under UPI:
 - ✓ Capital Markets, Insurance, Collections, Inward Remittances: up to ₹2 lakh
 - ✓ IPO and Retail Direct Scheme: up to ₹5 lakh per transaction
- Repo Rate and Liquidity Adjustment Changes:
 - Policy repo rate reduced by 25 basis points to 6% to encourage lending and investment.
 - Standing Deposit Facility (SDF) rate cut to 5.75%; SDF allows banks to park excess funds with RBI without collateral.
 - Marginal Standing Facility (MSF) and Bank Rate revised to 6.25%, serving as emergency borrowing options for banks.
- Inflation Target and Economic Growth Alignment:
 - These monetary adjustments support the RBI's commitment to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation target of 4%, within a flexible band of $\pm 2\%$, while simultaneously promoting economic stability and growth.

BANKING SYSTEM IN INDIA

3.1 National Urban Co-operative Finance and Development Corporation (NUCFDC)

Why in News

- NUCFDC has been highlighted as a national umbrella organization for Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs) under the Ministry of Cooperation.
 - It received its Certificate of Registration (CoR) from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in February 2024 to function as a Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC).
 - It must achieve ₹300 crore paid-up capital within a year to seek Self-Regulatory Organization (SRO) status from RBI.

FUNCTIONS OF RESERVE BANK OF INDIA

3.2 90th year of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI)

Why in News

- On April 1, 2025, the President of India attended the closing ceremony of RBI's 90th-year commemoration, where a special postage stamp featuring the 90-year logo and the message "Stability. Trust. Growth" was released.
- About RBI:

- Established in **1935** in **Kolkata**, based on the **Hilton Young Commission's recommendations**, under the **Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934**.
- It functions under the **Ministry of Finance**, with **Sir Osborne Smith** as the first governor and **Sir C.D. Deshmukh** as the first Indian governor (1943).
- RBI regulates India's **monetary and financial systems**, manages **currency issuance**, **foreign exchange**, **monetary policy**, and ensures **financial stability**.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN FINANCIAL SECTOR

3.3 Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC)

Why in News

- Since its launch in **2016**, the IBC has undergone **6 amendments** and **122 regulatory reforms** to enhance its efficiency in resolving insolvency cases.
- **Framework and Features:**
 - The IBC provides a **consolidated structure** for **insolvency resolution**, reorganization, and liquidation of **corporates, partnerships, and individuals**.
 - It promotes a **time-bound process**, mandates **insolvency professionals**, and establishes **insolvency professional agencies**.
- **Core Pillars of IBC:**
 - **Insolvency Professionals (IPs):** Manage the resolution, liquidation, and bankruptcy process.
 - **Information Utilities (IUs):** Maintain authenticated records of credit and default.
 - **Adjudicating Authorities (AA):** NCLT for corporate insolvency, DRT for individuals.
 - **Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI):** The apex regulatory body responsible for overseeing and issuing regulations.
- According to the **RBI's December 2024 Report**, the IBC accounted for **48% of all bank recoveries** in FY 2023–24, outperforming other mechanisms like **SARFAESI (32%)**, **Debt Recovery Tribunals (17%)**, and **Lok Adalats (3%)**.

OTHER NEWS

PRIMARY AND SECONDARY MARKET

3.4 Document Number Verification System (Sebi-DNVS)

Why in News

- The **Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI)** has launched the **Sebi-DNVS** to enhance transparency and allow verification of notices, summons, and other documents issued by SEBI.

BANKING SYSTEM IN INDIA

3.5 Prompt Corrective Action (PCA) Framework

Why in News

- Starting **April 2025**, around **500 weak UCBs** will shift from the **Supervisory Action Framework (SAF)** to the **PCA Framework**, which is designed to enable **early RBI intervention** and enforce **timely corrective actions** to ensure the financial health of these banks.
- Monitoring Parameters and Restrictions:**
 - PCA monitors **capital, asset quality, and profitability** (unlike commercial banks, which are assessed on leverage).
 - If a UCB's **net NPA exceeds 6%**, it must **raise additional capital** and is **prohibited from paying dividends**.
- Previously, **SAF (2012)** emphasized self-correction by bank management, whereas PCA involves more direct and stringent RBI oversight.

3.6 Priority Sector Lending (PSL)

Why in News

- RBI has issued revised guidelines for PSL under the **Reserve Bank of India (Priority Sector Lending – Targets and Classification) Directions, 2025**, effective from **April 01, 2025**.
- Major changes include:
 - Reduction of PSL target for Urban Cooperative Banks (UCBs)** from **75% to 60%** of ANBC/CEOBSE
 - PSL sub-target for micro enterprises** remains at **7.5%** (effective since May 10, 2018)
- Additional Modifications and Scope:**
 - The **loan cap for individual women beneficiaries by UCBs** has been removed.
 - These guidelines apply to **Commercial Banks (including RRBs, SFBs, LABs)** and **Primary (Urban) Cooperative Banks**, excluding **Salary Earners' Banks**.

3.7 One State, One RRB

Why in News

- The government has announced to implement the **"One State, One RRB"** policy for the consolidation of **Regional Rural Banks (RRBs)** across India.
- Scope of Consolidation:**
 - RRBs in **11 states** (including Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Maharashtra, etc.) will be **merged into single entities per state**.
 - Each merged RRB will be **sponsored by a major public sector bank** to ensure financial stability.

- With this **fourth round of consolidation**, the number of RRBs will reduce from **43 to 28**.
- All consolidated entities will have an **authorised capital of ₹2,000 crore**.
- **Ownership Structure (Post-Amendment):**
 - As per the **amended RRB Act, 2015**, the ownership is divided as:
 - ✓ **Centre: 50%**
 - ✓ **Sponsor Bank: 35%**
 - ✓ **State Government: 15%**
- **Current Sponsorship Landscape (As of March 2024):**
 - **SBI** sponsors the highest number (**14**), followed by **Punjab National Bank (9)** and **Canara Bank (4)**.
 - Other sponsors include **Bank of Baroda, Bank of India, Indian Bank (3 each), Central Bank of India (2)**, and several others with one RRB each.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN FINANCIAL SECTOR

3.8 National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID)

Why in News

- NaBFID is set to raise **₹8,000 crore** via its **first-ever five-year bond issuance**, aimed at **diversifying funding sources**. The bonds have been rated **AAA** by both **ICRA** and **CRISIL**, indicating strong creditworthiness.
- **About NaBFID:**
 - Launched in **2021** under the **Ministry of Finance**, with its headquarters in **Mumbai**, it serves to finance **long-term infrastructure projects**, especially in critical sectors.
 - It is the **5th All India Financial Institution (AIFI)** regulated by the **RBI**, alongside:
 - ✓ **Export-Import Bank of India (EXIM Bank)**

RBI Commemorates Completion of its 90th year

- RBI celebrated its **90th anniversary** on **1st April 2025**.
- RBI was **established in 1935** under the **RBI Act, 1934**, following recommendations of the **Hilton Young Commission**.
- RBI's **Central Office** was initially in **Kolkata** and was shifted permanently to **Mumbai** in **1937**.

RBI launches Verified WhatsApp Channel for Public Awareness

- RBI has expanded its 'RBI Kehta Hai' public awareness initiative by launching a verified WhatsApp account to share financial information.
- The aim is to enhance accessibility of key messages across all regions through digital outreach.

5. GOVERNMENT SCHEMES

Namami Gange Mission II

- **Launch:** 2023
- **Nodal Ministry:** Ministry of Jal Shakti
- **Aim:** To make villages on the bank of river Ganga **Open Defecation Free** and interventions dealing with solid and liquid waste management
- **Objectives:**
 - To clean and protect the Ganga River in a comprehensive manner
 - Watershed management of Ganga River basin and reducing runoff and pollution
 - To develop the villages located along the main stem of river Ganga which have historic, cultural, and religious and/or tourist importance
 - River Front Management
 - Conservation of Aquatic life
 - Creating co-ordination between different ministries involved
- **Tenure:** Up to 2026
- **Financial Outlay:** Rs. 22,500 crore
 - Including projects for existing liabilities — Rs. 11,225 crore
 - New projects/interventions — Rs. 11,275 crore

Key Features:

- **Funded By:** World Bank
- **Pillars:**
 - Sewerage Treatment Infrastructure
 - River-Front Development

- **National Level:** National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG)

- It covers **8 states/UTs, 47 towns & 12 rivers** under the project
- The Ganga-basin covers **11 states** viz., Uttarakhand, U.P., M.P., Rajasthan, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal and Delhi
- Current focus is on **five major states** on the main stem of river Ganga namely:
 - Uttarakhand

 - West Bengal
- Establishment of **Clean Ganga Fund** (charity fund) as a trust under the Indian Trusts Act
- **Donors are eligible for 100% IT exemption** and contributions also fall within the **purview of CSR activity**
- Its implementation has been divided into:
 - **Entry-Level Activities** (for immediate visible impact)
 - **Medium-Term Activities** (to be implemented within 5 years of time frame)
 - **Long-Term Activities** (to be implemented within 10 years)

National Critical Mineral Mission (NCMM)

- **Launch** – approved by Union Cabinet in January 2025
- **Ministry** – Ministry of Mines
- **Implementing Agency** – The Mission will involve a collaboration between the Ministry of Finance, relevant ministries, PSUs, private companies, and research institutions.
- **Aim** –
 - To create a **fast-track regulatory approval process** for critical mineral mining projects.
 - To **encourage Indian PSUs and private sector companies to acquire critical mineral assets abroad** and enhance trade with resource-rich countries.
 - It also proposes **development of stockpile of critical minerals within the country**.
- **Financial Outlay** – Rs.16,300 crore, expected investment of Rs.18,000 crore by PSUs, etc.
- It aims to explore, mine, process, and recover critical minerals crucial for high-tech industries, clean energy, and defense.
- **Geological Survey of India (GSI)** has been tasked with conducting **1,200 exploration projects** from 2024-25 to 2030-31.
- **Components:**
 1. Increasing Domestic Critical Minerals Production
 2. Acquisition of Critical Mineral Assets Abroad
 3. Recycling of Critical Minerals

4. Trade and Markets for Critical Minerals
 5. Scientific Research & Technological Advancement
 6. Human Resource Development
- Developing Effective Funding, Financing and Fiscal Incentives

Electronics Component Manufacturing Scheme (2025)

- **Ministry:** Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY)
- **Total Outlay:** ₹22,919 crore (including administrative expenses)
- **Launch Year:** 2025
- **Objective:**
 - Boost domestic manufacturing of electronic components and sub-assemblies.
 - Increase domestic value addition and reduce import dependency.
 - Integrate India's electronics industry with global value chains (GVCs).
 - Create employment opportunities in the manufacturing sector.

Key Features:

- **Types of Incentives:**
 - **Turnover-linked incentive:** a % of incremental sales over base year.
 - **Capex incentive:** a % of eligible capital expenditure.
 - **Hybrid incentive:** Combination of turnover and capex incentive.
- **Target Segments:**
 - **Sub-assemblies:** Display modules, camera modules.
 - **Bare Components:** Non-SMD passive components, Electro-mechanical parts, Multi-layer PCBs, Li-ion cells (excluding storage & mobility), Enclosures.
 - **Selected Bare Components:** HDI / MSAP / Flexible PCBs, SMD passive components.
 - **Supply Chain & Capital Equipment:** Components and machinery used in electronics manufacturing.
- **Eligibility:**
 - Both greenfield (new) and brownfield (existing) investments.
 - Separate applications for each product category.
- **Duration:**
 - Incentives applicable for **6 years** with a possible **1-year gestation period** (optional basis).
 - Applications open from **May 1, 2025**, initially for 2 years (for capital goods and supply chain segments).
- **Performance Criteria:**
 - Linked to incremental investment, turnover, and employment creation.
 - Base year for calculation: **FY 2024–25**.
- **Governance Mechanism:**

- Nodal agency to implement scheme.
- Project Management Agency (PMA) for application processing.
- Inter-Ministerial Governing Council (GC) for evaluation and approval.

Stand Up India Scheme

- **Eligibility:**
 - SC/ST and/or women entrepreneurs above 18 years of age.
 - Borrower should not be a defaulter with any bank/financial institution.
- **Nature of Loan:** Composite loan between Rs. 10 lakh and Rs. 1 crore through Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs).
 - **Purpose of Loan:** To set up a new enterprise in manufacturing, services, agri-allied activities, or trading by SC/ST/women entrepreneurs.
- **Size of Loan:**
 - Covers **85% of the project cost** (term loan + working capital).
 - If borrower's contribution + scheme support \geq 15% of project cost, this rule doesn't apply.
- **Interest Rate:** Lowest applicable bank rate for the category (not exceeding **base rate + 3% + tenor premium**).
- **Security:** Primary security required, plus collateral or **Credit Guarantee Fund Scheme** for Stand-Up India Loans (CGFSIL) as per bank's decision.
- **Repayment:** Loan **repayable within 7 years** with up to **18 months moratorium** period.
- **Working Capital:**
 - Up to Rs. 10 lakh: Overdraft with a Rupay debit card.
 - Above Rs. 10 lakh: Cash Credit limit.
- **Margin Money**
 - Up to **15% margin money**, with support from central/state schemes.
- Minimum 10% of project cost must be the borrower's own contribution.
