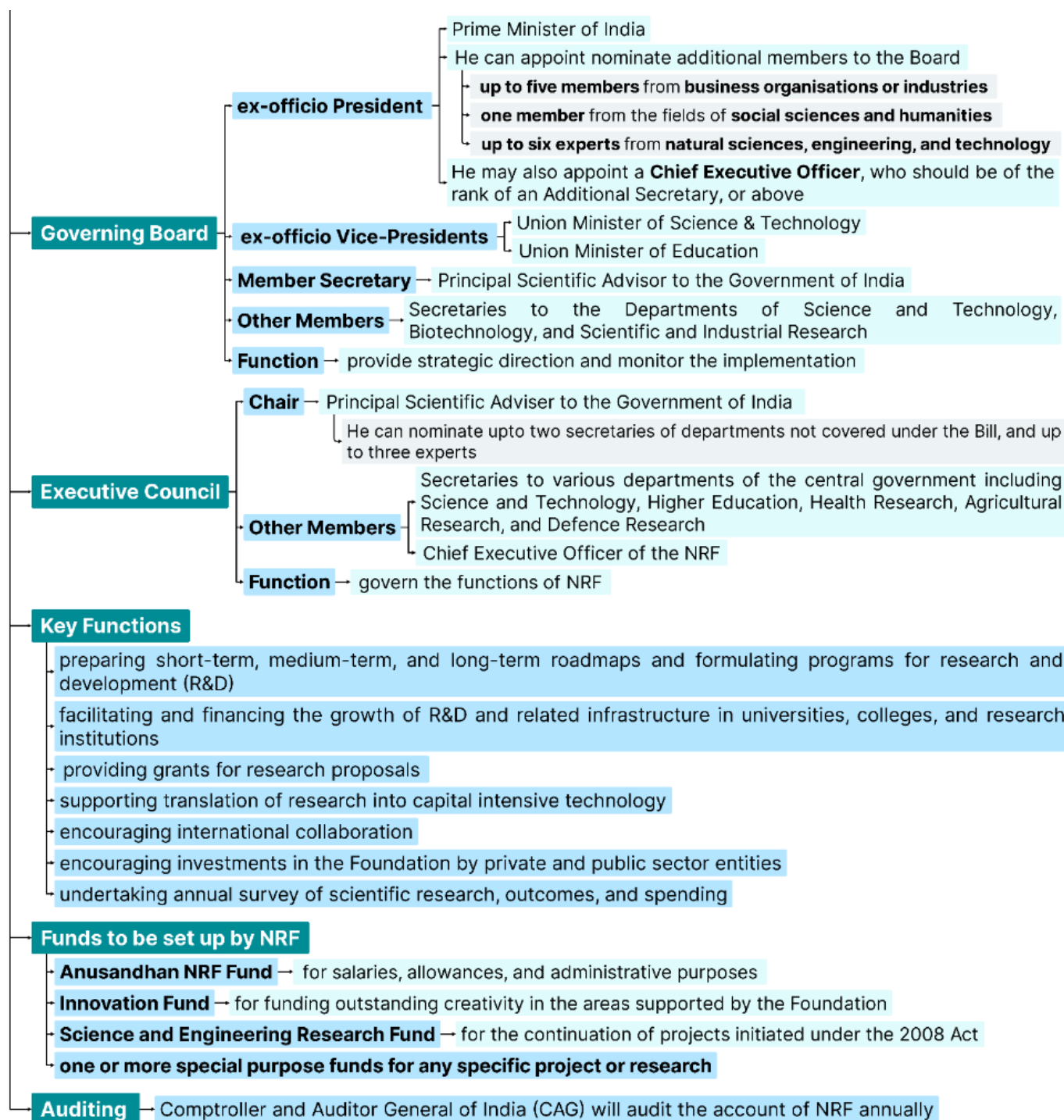

2.2 Draft UGC Regulations 2025

QUICK SYNOPSIS

- ❖ Union Minister for Education has released the draft *UGC (Minimum Qualifications for Appointment & Promotion of Teachers and Academic Staff in Universities and Colleges and Measures for the Maintenance of Standards in Higher Education) Regulations, 2025* aligned with the *National Education Policy (NEP) 2020*.

- ❖ *It aims to give flexibility to universities in appointing & promoting teachers and academic staff in their institutions.*

Why in News

- The Draft UGC regulations 2025, introduced by the education minister, streamline the Vice-Chancellor selection process for universities nationwide.
- A **mandatory Search-cum-Selection Committee**, constituted by the Chancellor or Visitor, will include **three experts to oversee appointments in universities** established under Central, Provincial, or State Acts.

Draft UGC regulations 2025

Key Highlights of the Regulations:

- **Flexibility:** Allows NET/SET-qualified candidates to teach beyond their degree specialisations, prioritising Ph.D. expertise.
- **Indian Languages:** Promotes their use in academic publications and programmes.
- **Holistic Evaluation:** Replaces score-based short-listing with a focus on broader qualifications and notable contributions.
- **Diverse Talent Pool:** Opens recruitment for experts in arts, sports, and traditional disciplines.
- **Inclusivity:** Welcomes accomplished sportspersons, including those with disabilities, into teaching roles.
- **Enhanced Governance:** Expands Vice-Chancellor eligibility with a transparent selection process.
- **Broadened criteria:** The regulation broadens eligibility for Vice-Chancellor posts to include professionals from industry, public policy, administration, and PSUs, moving beyond the traditional focus on academicians.
- **Simplified Promotions:** Prioritises teaching, research, and academic contributions.
- **Professional Development:** Advocates continuous learning through faculty development.
- **Transparency:** Ensures clarity in recruitment, promotions, and grievance redressal.

UNIVERSITY GRANTS COMMISSION

- **Established in 1956 under the UGC Act**, the UGC is a statutory body of the Government of India headquartered in New Delhi.
- Mandate includes
 - Promote and coordinate university education.

- Ensure standards in teaching, examination, and research.
- Frame regulations on minimum education standards.
- Monitor higher education developments and disburse grants.
- Advise Central and State governments on improving university education.

Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC)

- Incorporated as a **non-profit** in **December 2021** but launched in **April 2022**.
- **Implementing Agency:** DPIIT under Ministry of Commerce.
- **Objective:** To **democratize digital commerce** via an open, inclusive, and interoperable platform.
- **Founding members:** with **Quality Council of India and Protean eGov Technologies Limited**.
- **Authorized capital** of Rs. 500 crores.

- The ONDC model **seeks to replicate UPI's success in digital payments** by simplifying the entire online shopping process, just as UPI facilitates mobile payments through different payment apps.
- **Working of ONDC:**
 - **Decentralized Architecture:** Unlike traditional platforms, ONDC does not own or operate e-commerce services. It acts as an enabler for interconnectivity.
 - **Open Protocols:** Based on open standards, ONDC ensures that any seller or buyer platform adhering to these protocols can participate.
 - **Role Segregation:** Participants are classified into roles such as Buyer Applications, Seller Applications, and Logistics Providers, ensuring clear delineation of responsibilities.

- The Aspirational Districts Programme (ADP), **launched by the Government of India in January 2018**
- Coordinated by NITI Aayog, aims to transform 112 underdeveloped districts nationwide.
- The programme evaluates performance across five key sectors, each with assigned weightage:
 - **Health & Nutrition: 30%**
 - **Education: 30%**
 - **Agriculture & Water Resources: 20%**
 - **Financial Inclusion & Skill Development: 10%**
 - **Basic Infrastructure: 10%**
- These sectors encompass **49 Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)** to monitor progress.
- The ADP operates on the **principles of Convergence** (integrating Central and State schemes), **Collaboration** (among Central, State, and District officials), and **Competition** (fostering a spirit of competitive federalism through district rankings).
- The programme's objective is to improve the **quality of life and economic productivity in these districts**, thereby ensuring inclusive growth and development across the nation.

Centralized Pension Payments System (CPPS)

- Implemented by: Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO)
- Features:

 - **Streamlined Process:** Eliminates the need for physical verifications at banks; pensions are credited immediately upon release.
 - **Seamless Transfers:** No requirement to transfer Pension Payment Orders (PPOs) when relocating or changing banks/branches.
 - **Improved Efficiency:** Shifts from a decentralized system with limited bank agreements to a unified, centralized platform.

Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO)

- It is a statutory body under the **Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Act, 1952**.
- It is under the administrative control of the **Union Ministry of Labor and Employment**.
- EPFO operates the following three schemes:
 - Employees' Provident Funds Scheme, 1952 (EPF)
 - Employees' Pension Scheme, 1995 (EPS)
 - Employees' Deposit Linked Insurance Scheme, 1976 (EDLI)
- The EPFO schemes cover **Indian workers and international workers from countries** with whom EPFO has signed bilateral agreements.
- The EPFO schemes are administered by the Central Board of Trustees; representatives from the Government (Central and State), employers, and employees. The Union Minister of Labour and Employment chairs the Central Board of Trustees.

2.7 Rashtriya Karmayogi

QUICK SYNOPSIS

- ❖ *Recently the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions has initiated the training of Rashtriya Karmayogi - Large Scale Jan Seva Program for Central Government employees aiming to instill a spirit of public service (seva bhaav) and a deeper sense of purpose (svadharma).*

Why in News

About Capacity Building Commission (CBC)

- The Capacity Building Commission (CBC), established in 2021 by the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT), operates as **an independent body with full executive and financial autonomy**.
- **Composition:** CBC comprises three members from diverse backgrounds, including state governments, public and private sectors, and academia, ensuring a broad representation of perspectives.
- **Core Purpose:** To build credibility and shape a uniform approach to capacity building on a collaborative and co-sharing basis.

Mission Karmayogi

- The **National Programme for Civil Services Capacity Building (NPCSCB)- Mission Karmayogi** aims to create a **competent civil service rooted in Indian ethos**, with a shared understanding of India's priorities, working in harmonization for effective and efficient public service delivery.

- **Six Key Pillars Under Mission Karmayogi** are Policy Framework, institutional Framework, competency Framework, digital Learning Framework (iGOT-Karmayogi), electronic Human Resource Management System (e-HRMS) and monitoring and Evaluation Framework.

2.8 E-shram Portal

Why in News

- Union Minister of Labour & Employment has **launched** the **multilingual functionality** on e-Shram portal.

Key Highlights

- The portal will now be available in all **22 Scheduled Languages**, making eShram a 'One-Stop-Solution' and more **User-Friendly** and **User-Centric**.
 - The **previous version** was available only in English, Hindi, Kannada and Marathi.

About Bhashini (National Language Technology Mission (NLTM))

- Launched in July 2022
- It provides language technology solutions as digital public goods through the BHASHINI platform.
- **Aim:** To **transcend language barriers**, ensuring that every citizen can **effortlessly access digital services** in their own language.
- The approach is to create large datasets in the Scheduled Indian Languages to train AI models for translation and conversion of speech to text and vice versa.

Why in News

About the Panel:

- Headed by NITI Aayog member **Ramesh Chand**.

- The 18-member working group will look towards base revision of the current series of Wholesale Price Index (WPI) from base 2011-12 to 2022-23.

The Terms of Reference for the Working Group

- Recommending the commodity basket for WPI and PPI with a base year of 2022-23, considering structural economic changes.
- Determining the computational methodology for WPI and PPI.
- Evaluating the methodology for compiling PPI, as approved by the Technical Advisory Committee, and proposing enhancements in compilation and presentation while outlining a roadmap for transitioning from WPI to PPI.
- Reviewing and suggesting changes, if necessary, to the method for computing the linking factor.
- Proposing additional improvements to enhance the reliability of WPI and PPI.

KEY TERMS

Wholesale Price Index (WPI)

- The **Wholesale Price Index (WPI)** tracks price changes of goods at the wholesale level, reflecting inflation trends in **primary articles, fuel, and manufactured products**.

Purchasing Power parity (PPI)

- **Purchasing Power Parity (PPP)** compares currencies by **measuring the cost of identical goods and services across countries**, reflecting differences

Other terms include

- The Chairman of the Working Group may co-opt experts or representatives from other agencies as needed.
- The Working Group is required to submit its final report to the Office of the Economic Adviser within 18 months of the notification.

2.10 Indonesia joins BRICS bloc as full member

About BRICS

- ❖ *Acronym '**BRIC**' was coined by economist **Jim O'Neill** in 2001*
- ❖ ***BRICS** is an **intergovernmental informal grouping of 10 emerging economies** of the world.*

- ❖ *Members: Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, Iran, Egypt, Ethiopia, United Arab Emirates and Indonesia.*

Why in News

- Indonesia has formally joined the BRICS group, a bloc of emerging economies featuring India, Russia, China and others, viewed as a counterweight to the West.

BRICS

- BRICS is an **intergovernmental organisation comprising ten countries** – Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, Iran, Egypt, Ethiopia, United Arab Emirates and Indonesia.
- The acronym '**BRIC**' was coined by economist Jim O'Neill in 2001.
- **Founding countries of BRIC:** Brazil, Russia, India, and China.
- **First formal BRIC summit:** Held in 2009 in Yekaterinburg, Russia
- South Africa joined BRIC in 2010, transforming BRIC to BRICS.
- **3 Pillars of Co-operation:** Political and Security Cooperation, Financial and Economic Cooperation and Cultural and People to People Cooperation.

New members:

- In 2024, four new members- **Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, and the United Arab Emirates** - joined BRICS as full-time permanent members.
- In 2025, Indonesia was admitted as a full member of the BRICS.

2.11 European Council

QUICK SYNOPSIS

- ❖ *Prime Minister has congratulated **Antonio Costa** on the assumption of charge as the president of the European Council.*
- ❖ *The European Council is the **European Union's institution responsible for defining the general political direction and priorities of the EU.***

Why in News

- Prime Minister has congratulated Antonio Costa on the assumption of charge as the president of the European Council.

European Council

- **Establishment:** Formed as an informal forum in 1974; formalized by the Maastricht Treaty.
- **Headquarters:** Brussels, Belgium.
- **Composition:** Includes the heads of state or government of the 27 EU member states, the President of the European Council, and the President of the European Commission.
- **Meetings:** Convenes at least four times a year in Brussels, with additional meetings as needed.
- **Decision-Making:** Generally, operates by consensus; certain decisions require unanimity or qualified majority voting.

Functions:

- **Strategic Direction:** Sets the EU's overall direction and political priorities without enacting legislation.
- **Complex Issue Resolution:** Addresses intricate or sensitive matters unresolved at lower intergovernmental levels.
- **Foreign and Security Policy:** Establishes the EU's common foreign and security policy, considering strategic interests and defense implications.
- **High-Level Appointments:** Nominates and appoints candidates to prominent EU roles, such as the European Central Bank and the European Commission.

2.12 RBI adds 8 tons gold to its reserves in Nov 2024: WGC

QUICK SYNOPSIS

- ❖ *According to the World Gold Council (WGC), The Reserve Bank of India added 8 tonnes, increasing its total gold holdings to 876 tonnes.*
- ❖ *The National Bank of Poland was the largest buyer, adding 21 tonnes.*
- ❖ *In November 2024, central banks globally added 53 tonnes of gold to their reserves.*

Why in News

- According to the World Gold Council, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) added 8 tonnes of gold to its reserves in November, 2024.

- In 2024 Central banks, mostly from the emerging markets, were keen gold buyers, driven by the need for a stable and secure asset amid global economic uncertainties.

About RBI's Forex reserves

- **Foreign Exchange (Forex) Reserves** are assets readily available to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for:
 - **Financing Balance of Payments (BoP):** Addressing shortfalls in BoP.
 - **Forex Market Intervention:** Managing exchange rate volatility, such as selling dollars to curb rupee depreciation.
- **Accumulation of Forex Reserves:**
 - **BoP Surplus:** In periods of BoP surplus, the RBI purchases excess dollars from the market, thereby building forex reserves.
 - **BoP Deficit:** Conversely, a BoP deficit can lead to a depletion of these reserves.
- **Legal Framework:**
 - The **Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934** designates the RBI as the custodian of India's forex reserves.
- **Components of Forex Reserves:**
 - **Foreign Exchange Assets (FEAs):** Includes foreign currencies, foreign government securities, deposits with other central banks, and deposits with overseas branches of commercial banks.
 - **Monetary Gold:** Gold holdings maintained by the RBI as part of the forex reserves.
 - **Special Drawing Rights (SDRs):** International reserve assets allocated by the International Monetary Fund (IMF).
 - **Reserve Position in the IMF:** India's reserve tranche position, representing its quota contribution that can be utilized for financial transactions with the IMF.

World Gold Council (WGC)

- **About:** A nonprofit association of 33 leading gold producers, mainly gold mining companies.
- **Formation:** Established in **1987 to promote gold demand and usage.**
- **Headquarters:** London, UK.

Objectives:

- Promote and sustain gold demand through marketing, research, and advocacy.
- Set industry standards and ensure sustainability and fairness in gold mining.
- Maximize industry growth by monitoring and supporting gold consumption.
- **Major Contribution:** Developed the first gold exchange-traded fund.
- **Global Impact:** Covers markets **representing about 75% of global annual gold consumption.**
